Tom Danahy, President of Babcock Ranch, the ecological ranch and community project, will be the speaker at the Civic Association, March 21 Membership Meeting. He will describe the various aspects of the recently defined wilderness preserve, the existing ranch operation, the Babcock Ranch Community development, the IBM partnered technology, and the plans for the world's largest photovoltaic solar power plant.

The State of Florida and Kitson & Partners have mutually defined the retention of the majority of the huge ranch to remain as a ranch and an ecological preserve. The future city of Babcock Ranch has been designated to be the southwestern part of the original land (about 20%) and is the Kitson & Partners development.
